DOCUMENT PROBLEMS BEFORE CLEANING UP

STEP 1

☐ Know what your insurance policy covers.

☐ Keep photographic records of your damages.

☐ Familiarize yourself with your local building codes.

Report damage and downed services to your local officials and service providers ASAP.

PRIORITIZE SAFETY

Inspect your property.

STEP 2

Be careful when cleaning up and returning to your home.
Wear protective clothing.

Avoid standing water and downed power lines.

☐ Throw out old or rotting food, clothing, and other perishables.

Check for mold.

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF ASSISTANCE OPPORTUNITIES

STEP 3

FEMA Individual Assistance

- Check ISD's <u>Online Directory</u> of Assistance Resources periodically.
- Check Federal, State, and Local agencies.
- Review <u>Homeowners and Renter Assistance services</u> for mortgage loan forbearance, loss mitigation, and foreclosure prevention assistance.

STABILIZE THE SITUATION

Take steps to preserve your mental health.

- Be patient with your service providers as they make repairs.
- Sign up for trustworthy alert sources and stay informed.
- □ Work with a reputable dealer for services like generators,
 - plumbing, HVAC, etc.

STABILIZE THE SITUATION

STEP 5

- Identify the weak points where damage occurred.
- Don't just repair strengthen.
- Secure ongoing rain- and wind-prone risks, like cracks, dead trees, and outdoor furniture.
- Update your insurance policies.
- Participate in community planning discussions.
